

New proxies should be arriving shortly which would allow us to amend our documents if a Majority of our owners agree. This is an important proxy for Royal Park. Many times 1500 NW 38th street is added, but machines are programmed to read Royal Park.

Your address should read:

Mr. John Doe 119 Royal Park Drive 1-A Oakland Park, Fl 33309- 5857

Please note the separation of building and 1-A because it could read 1191-A or numbers could get transposed. All D.P.S. (delivery point sequence) mail is bar coded and read by machines, then bundled or banded for that building, street, or office. The carrier handles that mail at delivery point only. All mistakes, unknown, or wrong addresses are returned to the post office for redistribution, before I ever see them.

Zip+4...The last 4 digits are designated for route, floor, block, etc. As new operations come on line, a few flaws are bound to happen. Humans program machines, and they only work as well as we tell them. This week on your official bulletin board, the 4 digit add on for your apartment will be posted at each building.

The one shown on the example address is only for the office.

At times a "?" will appear on a letter addressed to your unit. This means that I don't recognize the name, but it could be your guest. If its not, put a check mark thru the name and address and then place it in the small outgoing mail box. I will review it and process it for delivery.

Names... Names on the outside of mailboxes is a must... but no room for more than two. The solution is to place a plastic pouch label on inside rear wall of receptacle for additional names. Use the back of an old business card for names of friends or holiday guests, etc.

Circulars, Magazines... As we all know, some of the post office revenue comes from circulars and other classes of mail. I place them in first, so they will open up and hopefully, first class mail will not get mixed in. Make sure you always look through all of the pages of the circulars to make sure that first class mail has not get mixed in. Any mail not wanted, please dispose of properly. If you leave it on top of mail boxes, it will be treated as misdelivery and be placed back in your nail box. The area sure looks messy hen all the unwanted mail is placed there.

The next issue will cover priority, press mail and other services. After 7+ years we are almost like family. Be sure to stop and say Hello, so we can add to our Family". Thanks for being so great!
