

"Wrong Address" Royal Park Office 119 1A Royal Park Dr. Oakland Park, FL 3309

The mail most likely will get to the Royal Park office. Suppose the bldg. or 1-A changes, the address will go into a forwarding machine as 1191A and my good friends that's NSN, (no such number).

Many patrons use 1500 NW 38 St. which is a good street address for Royal Park Condos, but with a 672 unit condo the carrier must know

the names or have bldgs. and apts. to read for delivery. I emphasize that correct address quite strong as it could possibly be 6-8 weeks before regular carriers bid and someone is awarded the route. In the interim, hopefully someone who has been here will be temporarily assigned to Royal Park.

A lot of owners/renters have applied those little plastic pouches with the cards which are for apt/names for the owners or occupants. This will help any new carrier or regulars to learn the names quickly. The apartment number would also help. You will find that pouch at the back panel of your box.

Four-digits are a must as machines will sort much of your mail. The zip, address, and 4 digits will get your mail to you quickly if correct to start with. Please use all the tools, the office has a 4 digit list if needed or it may still be posted on the bulletin boards.

I could go on but space will not permit. The form holder is still on the agenda, just need time. There may be another item coming soon as a hand out, so look for it. I have some photos of our paradise home and can make it up with address and directions if anyone would like to visit. Please do.

For those of you who have not attended our meetings or read the bulletin boards, you have until December 31, 1995, to register your pet with Royal Park. First of all, pets are not allowed. However, several boards have looked the other way, allowing Royal Park to be over-run with illegal animals. According to our attorneys, we may offer a ONE TIME adjustment. IF YOU HAVE AN ANI-MAL in Royal Park, you MUST bring, to the office: A picture of the animal: A valid rabies certificate; A declaration of ownership; and, sign a statement, that this is the only pet that you have. You WILL NOT be allowed to replace the pet when it dies. Anyone who has a pet in Royal Park after December 31, 1995, that HAS NOT been registered, will be subject to the removal of the animal. NO ONE will be allowed to have an animal over 20 pounds. NO ONE will be allowed to have an animal that creates a nuisance for the neighbors. EVERYONE that has an animal will be REQUIRED to pick up after the animal in the dog walk area. PLEASE, this is an easy one. JUST DO

Our city has been relatively quiet in recent months. Professionalism in the City Manager position seems to have solved the bickering problem. Where the commission used to be split, 3 to 2, it now seems to be a 4 to 1 split. This seems to indicate that more than a majority of our citizens are content with the way that the city is being run. I couldn't agree more. Other than the four or five people who speak, usually about computer chips being implanted in our children, or personal slights from 4 or 5 years ago, the city is conducting its business in a straightforward, no-nonsense way. THANK YOU Skip Johnston. Although most of us take advantage of Homestead Exemption, and pay relatively low taxes, do you realize that the city actually LOWERED the advalorum rate for taxes??? Well, they did! So, stop listening to the doom-sayers who shout that we're paying outrageous sums. LOOK FOR YOURSELF!!! Oakland Park lowered taxes this year. Remember that when it's time to vote again.

Hopefully, our trash weighing program will be passed by the commission in December, or by the latest, January. If you OWN your unit, and, therefore, are paying maintenance, PLEASE pay attention to this issue. It could save Royal Park THOUSANDS per month. If it does not pass, we can only blame ourselves. GET INVOLVED. Call the city manager, 561-6250. Tell him what YOU think. If you have friends in other condos in Oakland Park, explain the issue to them. If they don't understand, CALL ME. I'll show it to them in black and white, which equals green dollars!!!

The City will be rebating approximately \$950.00 to Royal Park for overcharges to our water and sewer bills over the last 10 years. Unfortunately, we can only recapture the last 2 calendar years, but in going over the bills, I found some discrepancies. Bert Wrains, City Finance director investigated my complaint, found it valid, and offered the rebate. WE NEED
