hen this issue of the Newsletter reaches your home, we will have undergone many changes in Royal Park. However, many things may STILL be the same. We will have a new Board of Directors, a seven member board,

as decided by the residents. Our owners moaned and groaned about the five member board being too small. Yet, by filing time, only 4 unit owners elected to run. Of those four, two have withdrawn. The optimist in me says that people are satisfied with the way Royal Park is being run. The pessimist is saying that no one cares enough to do anything but gripe and complain.

Volunteering in Royal Park, for the Association, is almost non-existent. We have our own little city here, and although many donate their time and energies to other organizations outside our gates, not many seem to realize that the association would welcome some participation. There are "crunch" times in the office, when Arlene could use some telephone, letter stuffing, bulletin posting or proxy soliciting help. Get your name on a list, so that YOU can help keep Royal Park a real community. (This does not mean that we do not recognize those who do volunteer with screening, building reps., etc..it just means that we need more people involved).

As with the outside world, Royal Park experienced its own little crime wave in January. We don't have an exact count of the bicycles that were stolen, but it was more than 15. As a result, we have met "Deb" Lytle, an Oakland Park Police Officer, who tried to instruct our residents in Crime Watch techniques and personal safety practices. We had a vehicle stolen in January also, although it has been recovered. The common denominator in these crimes is our own residents were the bad guys.

Of course, the first issue brought up was screening. Unfortunate. Screening is not the issue. Our volunteer screening committee is shackled by our documents. They must abide by our association rules, regs, and governing documents. For everyone who is upset with some of our residents, I ask, are you one of the 184 owners who decided NOT TO VOTE??? As of today, February 4, 1995, we have 438 YES, change the documents votes, 49 NO, the documents are wonderful votes, and almost 200 people who haven't returned a proxy. Sixty five percent of our residents want to change the documents.

There are those who have said, well, if you made it 66 2/3, I'd vote for it, but not 50% plus one. That means that one person could make a difference. I don't want to preach, but let's get real here. WE ARE THE ASSOCIATION, and for the last 3 years, we have been unable to hold an annual meeting, because we couldn't get proxies from 50% plus one of our residents!!!! (as of today, again, only 216 people have submitted a proxy for our meeting, which is tomorrow!). Yes, I know, "Well, I'm going to attend, so I don't need to submit a proxy".

A proxy is submitted as a substitution for your attendance. SUBMIT ONE!!. If you attend, you may cancel your proxy and represent yourself. If you get a great opportunity to go out for dinner, or if the love of your life shows up at 6:00 PM, or if there is an emergency, and your family needs you, you and I both know that you won't attend the meeting. That's why there are proxies. So, if there's NO emergency, or if that love of your life DIDN'T show up, and if everything is hunky-dory with your family, then you come to the meeting and revoke your proxy. It's easy. 

Helpful: Buy a pill splitter, which costs about \$5 and is available in most pharmacies... or ask your doctor about taking a regular-strength aspirin every other day – a regimen that can work just as well. n February 21, 1995, (Ash Wednesday), the City Manager, Robert, "Skip" Johnston, should be submitting an ordinance which will change the way that garbage collection is billed in the city of Oakland Park. For those of you who are sick of hearing about garbage, hopefully, this will be the last hurrah. Let's get to it.

Go to the meeting and voice your opinion about the ordinance. It's not even drafted yet, but, we KNOW, that it's got to save us money. Royal Park, (and I'm sure, other condos), have been subsidizing a lot of profit making businesses when it comes to trash. They're going to fix it!!! Let's show them that we are aware of their efforts. If you can't show up, write a letter to the city.(3650 NE 12 Ave., Oakland Park, 33334), expressing your opinion, thanks, whatever.

The homeless shelter problem appears to be resolved. The archdiocese of Miami has agreed to shelter only homeless women and children in the facility. It has been a controversial issue for over 3 years. The property in question is just east of the railroad tracks on Oakland Park Boulevard. Right now, it's a terrible eyesore, with weeds, broken windows, boarded up windows, etc.. They are also looking for volunteers to help in the office, telephoning, and miscellaneous stuff.

Another Healthy Breakfast

Scrambled tofu and grilled tomatoes - piled on thick granary toast...

Take 285g/1oz regular firm tofu, 15ml/ 1/2fl oz vegetable oil, 50g/2oz onion, finely diced, 1/2 small red pepper, finely diced, 1 small carrot grated, turmeric, shoyu and freshly ground black pepper.

Drain the tofu and mash it, or crumble by hand. Heat the oil and saute the vegetables until soft. Add the crumbled tofu and sufficient turmeric to give an attractive colour. Season with shoyu and pepper to taste. Serve hot. Yummy!
