PRESIDENT'S RAMBLINGS By Gerald Waldman

I want to thank all who supported me for the Board of Governors, and the majority of Governors who nominated, and voted for me as President.I promise to do the best job humanly possible.

Many of our neighbors have left for the summer and may not know all of the issues that have been resolved. This newsletter will hopefully keep them informed, while they are away.

As I am writing this message, we are preparing to repair and replace our concrete railings. When you return in the fall, they should all be finished.

The Board, also in good faith, voted down a motion to have the recreation lease refinanced. As a direct result of this vote, the four members who voted for its defeat, were served with a law suit. The law suit was turned over to our attorneys as the suit suggested.

We have had two managers since this Board took over in February of 1999. Our meetings for February, March and April, at times became quite heated. At one point, the agenda had two items to be resolved. The first was the removal of the President, which was voted down, and the other was the removal of the Treasurer, which was passed. One of our Board members resigned because of health reasons.

The President hired a new manager, who came highly recommended by his previous employers, where he worked for 10 years. It turned out, according to Tallahassee, he was not licensed, so he was terminated.

At this moment, your President is acting as manager until such time as the Board will be able to hire a bonified property manager.

I am in the process of going through the petty cash accounts, checks, contracts, etc., I will keep you apprised of the issues as they come to light.

Again, know that the Board will be listening to your concerns, and will respond as quickly as possible.

City Watch

Next month is a busy one for the citizens of Oakland Park. On June 9, a meeting will be held to discuss the "Neighborhood Entrance way Program". It will be at the Collins Community Center at 7:30 PM. The City has \$50,000 included in the budget to define the different neighborhoods. Royal Park could, along with Royal Palm, request and receive an area sign, or possibly brick pavers, etc. There are several homeowners' associations that want a piece of the pie, so, if we do, then we need to have representation at the meeting.

On June 23rd, also at the Collins Community Center and also at 7:30 PM, a Town Meeting will be held concerning budgetary requests. This will be the time for us to present our case for silencing the train horns. Royal Park has not taken an "official" stand. I do have background information, costs, and other related items, but, again, Royal Park must be represented or give someone authority to act on the Boards' behalf. We might consider an alliance with the Lloyd Estates/Prospect Gardens Homeowners' Association as well as with the Royal Palm Homeowners Association. Last year, they both expressed an interest. In addition to the train horns, any other expense that Royal Park wants the city to consider should be presented at that meeting. Last year, we were the only community that received the grass-eating carp. I presented that request in June of 1998. We didn't receive the fish until March of 1999. They seem to be effective in all of the canals surrounding Royal Park's property. An example of tax dollars well spent!

A Budget Workshop and Goal Setting will be the last chance for Royal Park to make its wishes known. That session will be at the City Commission Chambers, at 7:30 PM, on June 30.

All of the meetings mentioned will be televised on Comcast Channel 38. All Oakland Park residents are invited to attend and participate. Royal Park should have an agenda to present. We've seen the effects of failing to have a long range plan, and to prevail in our wishes and needs, Royal Park should have a coherent "Wish List" to present to the City. We should not expect to receive everything that we


